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Current State of Affairs for Canadian Black Youth

Issues

- Black Youth: Lower academic and employment outcomes in STEM and business fields
- Black Youth: Limited access to post-secondary education and employment
- Black Youth: Lower perception of educational attainment
- Black Youth: 94% would like to obtain a university degree. Only 60% think they will obtain one
- Black Youth: Experience unemployment rates 3.75 times higher than general population (24% currently)
- Black Canadians: Majority employed in low wage sectors (e.g., food and beauty)
- Black Graduate Students: Pipeline underdeveloped

What is Needed?

- Experiential learning and work-integrated training opportunities
- Engagement in high wage professional sectors
- Skills development in technology ecosystems
 - 14 26% increase in demand by 2030
- Paid internships
- Social and emotional skills development
 - 13 28% increase in demand by 2030
 - Leadership, entrepreneurship, negotiation
 - Adaptability, continuous learning, teaching and training others
 - Communication, self awareness and wellness

The ELITE Program Solution: Overview



- Create opportunities for Black Youth to access experiential learning and work-integrated training
- Focus on STEM fields and entrepreneurship
- Include disrupter technology areas
 - Robotics
 - Precision medicine
 - Tissue engineering
 - Regenerative medicine
 - Artificial intelligence
 - Advanced manufacturing
 - Quantum technologies
 - Space technologies
 - Finance and economics

Leadership and Entrepreneurship

Hands-on work-integrated training

- Interns work for up to 8 to 16 weeks
- At least 4 workdays per week on job
- 25 to 32 hours per week on site with company

ELITE Program Wellness and Coaching Series

- Coaching with registered psychologists
- **Build resiliency**
- Develop strategies to maintain such resiliency
- Three hours per week for 8 or 16 weeks
- Led by Dr. Sophie Yohani, R. Psych

Entrepreneurship Design Series

- Startup creation, financing, customer base development, financial literacy
- One workday per week for 8 weeks
- Led by Edmonton Unlimited and Black Business Ventures Association

ELITE Program Impact – The Interns




Over 4 years 200 youth interns trained 200 paid jobs created Youth hope and resilience increased Youth report feeling prepared for workforce





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ELITE Program Impact – 2023 Engagements




Language Demographics

Concluding Statements and Next Steps for Impact

- Paid work-integrated STEM-based training program for Black youth
- Broaden engagement with workforce players: For-profit industry for permanent jobs and youth entry to workforce
- Remain connected to post-secondary institutions to support transition from high school
- Pathway to research, graduate studies, and applied work: Extension of program evaluation and playbook development
- Retain targeted wrap-around training in entrepreneurship and wellness management
- Model for further expansion and growth in Canada: Bring interns from outside Edmonton for national expansion
